INET welcomes reports of new research on all aspects of school, family, and community partnerships:

- Advances in quantitative and qualitative methods of research on partnerships
- Effects of policies on family and community engagement at the school, district, state, and/or national levels
- Family involvement and results for students at the preschool, elementary, middle, and/or high school levels
- Issues of equity in engaging families with diverse socioeconomic, racial, and cultural backgrounds
- Role of technology in improving communications from school-to-home and home-to-school
- Students' voices and roles in partnership programs
- Preparing future teachers and administrators to organize strong and sustainable partnership programs
- Scaling up effective interventions to improve family and community engagement
- Connections with the community
- YOUR research question on partnerships and new findings.
